Biographical Sketch

Charles I. Doyle, S.J., was born in Chicago on July 31, 1889, one of five children of James Doyle and Rose Donnelly. He attended St. Jarlath Parish School, then St. Ignatius High School, from which he graduated in 1906. Following three years of work at United States Steel, he entered the Society of Jesus at Florissant, MO, in 1910. Doyle received his bachelor's degree and master's degree from Gonzaga University in 1918 and 1919 respectively, then studied in Belgium prior to being ordained in 1924. From 1919 to 1926, he taught at St. Mary's College in Kansas; Marquette University; Enghien, Belgium; and St. Louis University, before serving as the associate editor for *America* from 1927 to 1931. He returned to St. Louis University in 1931 to teach and pursue his doctorate in Psychology which he received in 1933. That same year Doyle joined the faculty of Loyola University Chicago. He was appointed the chairman of the Psychology department in 1934, a position he retained until 1945, and in 1941 founded the Child Guidance Center, later renamed the Charles I. Doyle, S.J., Center, where he served as director until 1963. From 1963 to 1970 he continued to conduct research and counseling, passing away at the Jesuit Colombeire College retirement center in Clarkston, MI, in 1973.

Scope and Content

The Charles I. Doyle, S.J., papers consist of 2.0 linear feet of correspondence; writings; sermons; minutes; photographs; and family papers spanning from 1846 to 1973 with the bulk of the materials dating from 1929 to 1963. Subjects include Loyola Psychology Department; Loyola Child Guidance Center; sermons; and Doyle family history. Some

sermons are in Latin. Arrangement is chronological within series except for sermons which are arranged by holiday, Gospel, or alphabetically.

Series

Series 1: Personal, 1912-1970, Box 1

Series 1 includes curriculum vitae, correspondence, passport, an honorary degree, church bulletins, and photographs pertaining to Charles I. Doyle's life, education, and Golden Jubilee as a Jesuit.

Series 2: Doyle Family Papers, 1846, 1962-1964, 1932-1970, n.d. Box 1

Series 2 includes genealogies, correspondence, histories, wills, and photographs. Subjects include James M. Doyle, Civil War, Leo J. Doyle, Eleanor M. Doyle, and Julia Doyle. The James M. Doyle Civil War diary and letter have been moved to the University Archives autograph collection.

Series 3: Professional Activities, 1929-1964, n.d., Boxes 1-4

Series 3 contains reports, minutes, memos, newsletters, correspondence, speeches, writings, sermons, and Loyola Educational Digest information, and is divided into four sub-series:

Sub-series 3A: Loyola Educational Digest, 1924 – 1930, contains cards and brochures from the Loyola Educational Digest.

Sub-series 3B: Loyola University, 1929 – 1964, n.d., contains information on the Psychology department and the Loyola Child Guidance Center.

Sub-series 3C: Sermons, n.d., contains the sermons written and delivered by Charles I. Doyle, S.J.

Sub-series 3D: Writings and Talks, 1936-1938, 1948-1958, contains writings and talks by Doyle.

Subjects include Loyola department of Psychology, Loyola Child Guidance Center, child development, and *Loyola Educational Digest*.

Series 4: Writings by Others, 1916-1939, n.d., Box 4

Series 4 contains published writings, commencement and conference papers by other people. Authors include George Cardinal Mundelein, Daniel Lord, and Laurence W. Smith.
