Administrative History

Founded in 1962, the Rome Center of Loyola University Chicago began as an idea and inspiration of John Felice, SJ, then Professor of Theology at Loyola who envisioned a “Center of Humanistic Studies in Rome.” In February 1962, Felice, along with 90 students, headed toward Rome for what was supposed to be a single semester of study, a test of the feasibility of making the program more permanent. The first building to house the Rome Center was called CIVIS (Centro Internazionale Viaggi Istruzione Studenti), on loan from the Italian government for the purpose of better facilitating international student travel. The complex of buildings was originally constructed for the 1960 Rome Olympics. Present were ninety students and seven faculty, all of whom studied the humanities. By August of 1962, the Rome Center already expanded in scale: increased number of students, faculty, and shortly after in 1963, geographic size when the group took over an entire CIVIS building, rather than the two floors it occupied for the last year. At the time, room/board/tuition plus the round trip charter flight ticket and two week tour of Europe totaled just over \$2100. By 1964, the faculty grew in number to 24, and in two years, the Rome Center physically outgrew the facilities of CIVIS.

At the end of the spring semester, 1966, the Rome Center moved locations to the Villa Tre Colli, property owned by the Vatican State to begin a five-year lease. The property consisted of several buildings and 25 acres, on which a student union, tennis courts, and basketball court were built. Each year, from 1966 to 1972, student attendance grew by twenty to thirty over the year before, while faculty increased steadily as well. 1972 also marked the end of the Rome Center’s stay at the Villa, which then moved to a third location, the Villa Maria Teresa. The 1972 – 1973 academic school year was pivotal for another reason, however, as founder and long time director, John Felice retired from the position and was replaced by John T. Dillon, SJ. Notably, Felice stayed

on at the center as Dean of Students. As the Rome center continued to grow throughout the 1970s, tuition increased reaching \$4550 by 1976. 1976 also witnessed a new Director, Thomas L. Hogan, SJ who combined the position of directorship with that of Academic Dean. The enrollment fell to an all time low of 158 students, and remained steadily low which forced the Rome Center in 1979 to relocate to smaller facilities at Via Massimi 114/A, which was rented from the Dominican Sisters of St. Catherine of Sienna and is where the Rome Center remains as of 2004. Shortly afterward, John J. Kilgallen SJ became the fourth director of the Rome Center and enrollments increased steadily. The fifth director of the Rome Center was named in 1981, James Arimond, SJ, who helped celebrate the 20th Anniversary of the Rome Center the following year. By that watershed year, tuition had increased to \$7000, there were 140 faculty members, 20 administrators and support staff, and over 85 American colleges represented each year through the student body. Departments typically and consistently represented at the Rome Center included Anthropology, Business, Classical Studies, Education, English, Fine Arts, History, Italian language, Philosophy, Political Science, Psychology, Theatre, and Theology.

As of 2004 the Rome Center remains touted as a small American university in Europe featuring new courses in International Studies, Peace Studies, Rome Studies, and Sociology. The library at Via Massimi, which once held only 40,000 titles, now holds over 100,000. Faculty, number around 20, with approximately 9 full time, and most on a one year appointment to teach abroad.

Scope and Content

This collection consists of 18 boxes, spanning the years 1961 to 1997, being predominantly from 1962 to 1985. The collection concerns most of the major and minor administrative activities and programs of the Loyola University Chicago Rome Center including information about the original Rome Center Campus, CIVIS, correspondence between the Rome Center and the Office of Foreign Studies at Loyola University Chicago LSC, Faculty, Enrollment, Grading Policies, and Student Life. Other records of interest include Publicity, History, Events held at the Rome Center Campus, and extensive general correspondence concerning Rome Center affairs. The materials are generally arranged chronologically within topical series listings. The only exception to this format is "Individual Correspondence" which is arranged alphabetically by author of the letter. Original order was maintained when possible.

Series 1: Administration, 1961-1997, n.d. Boxes 1-2

Contains numerous reports and meeting minutes, including those from the Council on Student Travel, Board of Undergraduates, the Basshart Report, the Hunter Report, the Casey Report, Dean's Reports, Rome Center Development, and Student Recruitment among others. Additional records include affiliation with other universities reports/reviews, overview studies of European academic programs, faculty appointment, goals and development plans for the Rome Center.

Series 2: CIVIS, 1962-1966, n.d. Box 3

Includes materials related to the founding of the Rome Center, miscellaneous reports including topics of international educational standards, proposals for research centers within CIVIS, and educational tours. Limited correspondence includes students' inquiries, faculty recruitment, and general administration. The CIVIS series is related directly to Series 10: Architecture/Buildings which feature schematics for the original CIVIS building.

Series 3: Correspondence, 1962-1989, n.d. Boxes 4-6

Contains correspondence only, and is broken into three subseries: **Subseries 3A: Individuals, 1962-1989, n.d.** lists in alphabetical order correspondence from individuals including Raymond Baumhart, Patrick Casey, Matthew Creighton, Walter Gray, and Richard Matre among others. Much of this correspondence is administrative in nature concerning policies, faculty, and enrollment. **Subseries 3B: Office of Foreign Studies, 1962-1978** included correspondence from the Office of Foreign Studies only and is generally related to administrative policy only. This subseries is organized chronologically. **Subseries 3C: Topics, 1962-1993, n.d.** includes correspondence listed by topic and includes information about tours, cooperation with other universities, health insurance, schedules and courses, and student letters. This subseries is organized alphabetically.

Series 4: Enrollment, Grading, Schedules, 1962-1996 Boxes 7-8

Contains records related to enrollment statistics and survey's typically conducted by the Rome Center and includes topical analysis of enrollment by department, home school/university, blind GPA comparison, and student roster by year. Materials related to grading are solely concerned with grading policies, not actual student grades received. Course schedule are also represented, in chronological order, and often include drafts of schedules as well as the final lists.

Series 5: Events, 1965-1997, n.d. Box 9

Includes multiple files on public, student-centered, faculty lectures and other miscellaneous events held at the Rome Center. Most are concerned with lectures, but also plays, student presentations, and Catholic Mass announcements of particular or special interest. Other events covered are related to the 20th and 25th anniversaries of the Rome Center and special visits by religious or political dignitaries.

Series 6: Faculty, 1962-1996, n.d. Box 10

Includes most records related to faculty business including faculty meeting minutes, faculty reports, and reports about faculty. Other records include memos to faculty and materials related to faculty deaths while in the employ of the Rome Center. **Subseries 6A: Dr. Michael Fink, 1962-1991, n.d.** Records relate solely to long-time faculty member Michael Fink who was largely responsible for the educational tours, who had extensive contact with the administration and committee work, and includes materials related to his death in 1980.

Series 7: Miscellaneous, 1972-1975 Box 11

Includes materials related to the Milford Jesuitica Library Collection donated to the Rome Center in 1972. The records include inventory lists and correspondence related to the donation.

Series 8: Publicity & History, 1962-1997, n.d. Boxes 11-12

Contains, first, records concerning the publicity, advertising, and newsletters of the Rome Center including "Ciao Roma" newsletter, "The Bulletin" newsletter, and numerous brochures advertising the programs of the center. **Subseries 8A: History, 1962-1982, n.d.** includes materials related solely to histories, drafts and final reports, of the Rome Center. This subseries also includes a Rome Center chronology, and a report on the historic purpose and goals of the Rome Center. **Subseries 8B: Newspaper Clippings, 1962-1987, n.d.** includes newspaper clippings about the Rome Center

from 1962 to 1987, with most of the 1970s absent. Other news accounts of the Rome Center include articles from the *Chicago Sun-Times*, the *Chicago Tribune*, and *Loyola Today*.

Series 9: Student Life, 1962-1995, n.d. Box 13

Contains a variety of records related to students and student life at the Rome Center including brochures, letters of welcome, student handbooks, students newsletters, reunions, orientations, grading policies and lists of students in attendance.

Series 10: Architecture/Buildings, n.d. Map Case Drawer 15

Includes two folders of oversized materials. The first folder contains three Rome Center posters that are undated. The second folder contains 6 separate building schematics, mostly unlabeled, but one of which is marked CIVIS.

Series 11: Restricted Materials, 1963-1993, n.d. Boxes 14-18

Primarily the restricted materials relate to student financial records, student grade records, transcript copies, listings of students by name and GPA, student applications, student medical records, and limited correspondence to/from students or to/from parents concerning disciplinary problems, student finances/debt, students in legal problems (arrests, criminal actions).
