The Old Irving Park Community Clinic (OIPCC) is a free, volunteer-based primary care and behavioral health care facility. OIPCC was founded in 2007 by George Maltezos, LCPC and Dr. Charles Martinez on the belief that all people, regardless of socio-economic status, have the right to quality healthcare.

Our objective is to provide quality, free, culturally competent medical and behavioral health care in a dignified and respectful manner to uninsured and under-served adult individuals. OIPCC treats patients from the Chicago area primarily from the northwest side.

OIPCC believes in early treatment for medical conditions to decrease risk of long-term complications. Patients are seen by appointment only. OIPCC is not a walk in clinic or emergency clinic.

OIPCC depends on our volunteers to assist with a variety of support activities for the clinic and our patients. Medical professionals, students, and community members are welcome to volunteer at OIPCC.
