

Some Article Highlights, cont'd

- What drives technology investment? Research, student/faculty expectations, administrative requirements are noted, but we've tackled these at Loyola in the reverse order for various reasons
- Every article references communications; developing a plan, sending regular and targeted messages, communicating relationship of IT to institutional strategies and goals
- Gartner and Educause Top-Ten Predict labor shortages in IT; staffing, recruiting, retention and skillset inventories/planning (technology balanced with business skillsets noted as important)
