THREE MAIN PARTS OF VOTER REGISTRATION

- The Ask
- The Process
- The Follow-Up



THE ASK


- Keep it simple
 - “Hi! Would you like to register to vote?”
 - Let students know that registration will only take about 5 minutes
- **If they are registered:**
 - Do they need an absentee ballot? A mail-in ballot? To know where their polling place is?
- **If they are unsure if they've registered:**
 - Take them to www.vote.org to check
- **If they are not registered:**
 - Ask if they'd like to register—but remember that we can't force them to register!

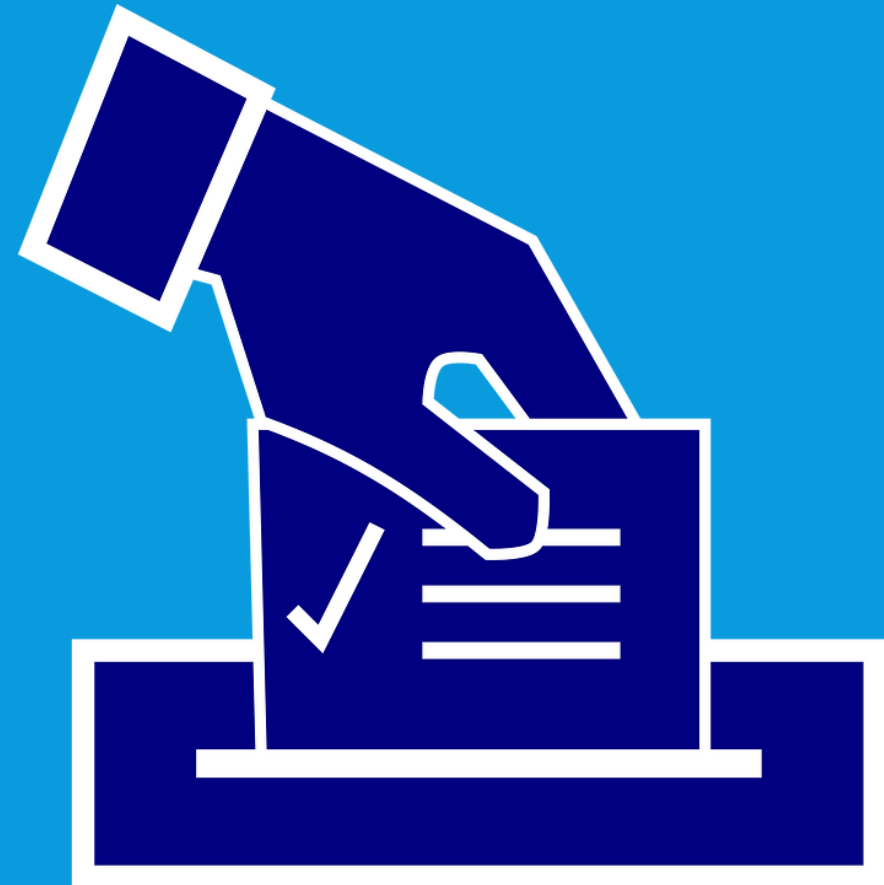
REMEMBER... TO VOTE, YOU MUST:

- Be a United States citizen
- Be at least 18 years old by Election Day
 - Next election day is November 8, 2022
- Live in the election precinct at least 30 days before the election
- Not be registered anywhere else
 - You can switch your voter registration back and forth if you live on campus and back home throughout the year. You can only hold one registration at a time.



THE PROCESS: CHECKING REGISTRATION

IF THEY ARE NOT REGISTERED...

THE PROCESS: IN STATE

- Check to see if they have an Illinois State ID or license
- If **Yes**, use the online form from the [Illinois Online Voter Registration Application Website](#).
- If **No** but they know the last 4 digits of their SSN, use the same online form, and have them print the form on campus when they are done, attaching the proper forms of identification.
- If **No** and they don't have last 4 digits of their SSN, tell them they can print the manual form and complete their registration by mail.
 - They will mail the form to the State Board of Elections, Voter Registration Department with either
 - A copy of a current and valid photo identification, or
 - A copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck or other government document that shows your name and address.
- Finally -- Give the patron a "What Now?" form

THE PROCESS: OUT OF STATE

- Direct the student to <https://www.vote.org/register-to-vote/>
- Most states require a license/state ID or SSN
 - If the state has an online form the student can register with, help walk the student through the form.
 - If the student is unable to register online and needs to use a printed form, instruct them to print the form using one of the printers located on campus.
 - They can bring the form back to us if they have questions.

THE PROCESS: GETTING AN ABSENTEE BALLOT / VOTING BY MAIL

- Direct the student [here](#).
- Walk them through the form if they need help
- If their state requires them to submit a request by mail, instruct them to print the proper form on campus and follow the instructions.
 - They are welcome to return to the table for help.



IMPORTANT: HELPING IN A SECURE WAY

- Voter Registration Volunteers must help students in a safe and secure manner.
- You should not be collecting students' personal information like their SSNs or identification information.
- Your job is to help guide students and answer any questions they may have. Do not fill out the forms for them.
- Students should input their personal information themselves unless unable to do so.

IMPORTANT: REMAINING NON-PARTISAN

- All voter registration endeavors done through Loyola must be conducted in a non-partisan manner. If you have any questions about what this means and what actions are prohibited, please see the [Guidelines for Political Activity for Students, Faculty, and Staff](#).
- Students may ask you what party/candidate this registration is for. Let them know this is a **non-partisan** event
- During voter registration endeavors you cannot:
 - Encourage a student to register with a specific party.
 - Encourage a student to register in a particular state.

OTHER ITEMS

Stamps and Envelopes

- We will provide stamps and envelopes at our events. If a student needs either after the tabling events, they can visit the Damen desk.
- Students must prove they are sending voting-related mail to receive an envelope or stamp.

Notary Services

- Some states require students to have their forms notarized. Please see [here](#) for more information.

AFTER THEY ARE DONE

- Give the student a "What Now?" Flyer with important information about their next steps.
- Remind them they can always visit our website or reach out to us if they have questions.

OTHER HELPFUL HINTS

- Emphasize how easy/quick registration is
- If there's time, [vote.org](https://www.vote.org) also has election reminders—students can sign up to be notified of important dates
- ALL STATES allow absentee voting
