**Biographical History**

Margaret Lanterman received a M.F.A in sculpture from the University of Illinois and studied painting at Quincy College and Miami University. She was an early member of the women's co-op Artemisia Gallery. She has featured her work in solo and group shows in major galleries and museum throughout the Midwest, the U.S., and Great Britain. Her sculptures represent individual, human interactions. Her work aims to display the personality and emotion of an individual by capturing a single gesture. Lanterman taught at the School of the Art Institute of Chicago, Triton College, and currently teaches at DePaul University.
